REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL RE-BID # 18-04-1825V.I

The Navajo Nation Department of Water Resource (NNDWR) – Technical, Construction, and Operations Branch (TCOB) is seeking qualified firms to develop a Final Design and construct the Helium Lateral Siphon Project that is part of the Hogback-Cudei Irrigation Project in Shiprock, New Mexico. The purpose for this project is to replace Helium Siphon pipeline which failed in 2010. The siphon route also requires modification to avoid new development that has encroached onto the existing siphon's route. This project will complete final design and construction of the new pipeline.

The Bid Proposal shall include one (1) original and three (3) duplicate copies of the following:

- 1. A narrative outlining the project approach, qualifications, current workload and capability;
- 2. A list of past projects completed on the Navajo Nation;
- 3. A list of three references and phone numbers from recent clients;
- 4. Copy of License and Insurance Certifications;
- 5. Fee Schedule in its own sealed envelope inside the bid packet. Clearly indicate "FEE SCHEDULE" on the sealed envelope.

The contract will be awarded to the proposer who submits the best proposal in terms of: 1) Products and services; 2) Experience; 3) Credentials; 4) Project Budget; and 5) Installation plans (i.e., construction approach narrative – we want to see how you will handle the work) and schedules. Adherence to the bid instructions is paramount, otherwise, Navajo Nation Business Regulatory Department will disqualify the bid for non-compliance.

The Navajo Nation reserves the right to reject any and all proposals not within projected budget and may elect to award the contract not solely on the bid amount but the bidder's qualification. The due date for proposal is August 17, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS AND GENERAL INFORMATION

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Helium Siphon begins at Hogback Canal, crossing the San Juan River and discharges into the Helium Lateral. The siphon is fed by the Hogback Canal and is located in the Shiprock Chapter. It serves 951 acres via a 40-inch steel coal tar pipeline approximately 9,750 feet long.

This project will replace the Helium Siphon, rehabilitate the concrete intake structure with a new trash rack, safety rope, a new outlet structure, and install turnouts according to the conceptual design. The last third of the siphon will be rerouted to better serve the farmland. The existing siphon will be abandoned through the residential areas south of the San Juan River.

Deficiencies include:

- The siphon has failed and no longer conveys water
- It is possible that the section under the San Juan River has collapsed
- A new trash rack is needed at the siphon inlet
- Safety features are required at the intake structure

The existing 40-inch steel pipe will be replaced with a 36-inch plastic pipe. The existing inlet structure is functional and will be rehabilitated and used for the new siphon. The proposed alignment will be west of the existing siphon. The proposed 36-inch siphon alignment is 11,300 feet long and follows the existing alignment for approximately 5,180 feet, crossing the Bluff Road and San Juan River. Upon crossing the floodplain, the proposed alignment diverts from the existing siphon to avoid new development. The new alignment continues along the edge of the development until it ties into the existing Helium Lateral. A new outlet structure is required at the new tie-in location. PVC pipe will be used throughout except at road and river crossings.

SCOPE OF WORK

Task 1: Final design including:

- 1. Final design on inlet structure, pipe, route, river crossing, tie-in at outlet, lateral pipe to the school and existing pipe abandonment based on the conceptual design
- 2. 30%, 60%, and 90% final design review with the Navajo Nation, the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and other entities as needed. Design reviews will include:
 - a. Presentation of design and drawings
 - b. Design review meetings
 - c. Accountability report indicating how all comments from the design review meetings will be addressed and incorporated into the design by the Contractor
 - d. Provide written approval of the deliverables to the NN for completion of each design review phase before proceeding to the next phase in the design until completed
- 3. Stamped final design report by a licensed professional engineer in the State of New Mexico with drawings and specifications
- 4. Investigation of river crossing to determine if existing pipe is suitable for use in crossing the San Juan River

Task 2: Permit Requirements and Coordination. The Contractor will coordinate with the NN to ensure all permits, necessary clearances, permits, easement, etc. as needed to execute the project are obtained

prior to construction. This includes, but not limited, to the following:

- 1. Environmental Clearance This will be either an environmental assessment or categorical exclusion resulting in a Findings of No Significant Impact (FONSI) issued by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Navajo Regional Office. This process also includes addressing Threatened and Endangered Species and cultural resources.
- 2. Clean Water Act (CWA) Section 401 and 404 permits.
- 3. Temporary Construction Easement (TCE) Obtain a TCE that will entail survey for the TCE required by the NN Land Department as part of the application.
- 4. Rights-of-Way (ROW) Obtain ROW for all facilities in design that will entail legal survey work to define ROW area, obtain Permission to Survey permit and consent for ROW for private lands including allotments.
- 5. Sand and Gravel Lease (if required) If local earthen or rock material is used, a Sand and Gravel Lease will be required. This does not apply to material imported from non-trust private land or material purchased from a licensed source. Application is made to the Navajo Nation Land Department in Window Rock, Arizona. The Design Specifications must have the construction contractor responsible for the payment of royalty fees unless waived by the NN.

Task 3: Construction

- 1. Contractor will furnish all materials, labor and equipment
- 2. Mobilization and demobilization
- 3. Secure storage location and security
- 4. Site and route preparation
- 5. Excavation and grading
- 6. Dewatering
- 7. Pipe installation including valves and fittings
- 8. Demolition and disposal
- 9. Electrical, mechanical, structural and concrete work
- 10. San Juan River crossing
- 11. Identify and locate all utility and road crossings
- 12. Backfill and restoration of entire project area
- 13. Commissioning
- 14. Develop and provide Standard Operating Procedure manual

Task 4: Project Management

- The Contractor shall perform project and budget management throughout the duration of the
 project and organize and attend periodic project meetings as needed. Periodic project meetings
 shall be held monthly, at a minimum, with more frequent meetings scheduled as needed during
 key points in the design process. Note that these meetings are in addition to the design review
 meetings.
- 2. The Contractor shall prepare periodic progress reports and submit them to the NN on a monthly basis. These reports shall fully describe the work completed during the previous report, schedule with critical path that includes the permitting activities and shall include details regarding the remaining project budget and percentage of work completed.

The Navajo Nation is not responsible for any "Down Time" of equipment; i.e., lateness of delivery of materials, equipment stoppage to clarify design, any act of negligence on the part of the contractor to maintain equipment in proper working order, any unforeseen occurrence, etc. These are not billable to the Navajo Nation and will not be considered for payment in the event of stoppage of work.

SPECIFICATIONS

Bid items will be according to the attached specifications.

DELIVERABLES

The Contractor shall provide the NN with both electronic and hard copy versions of the final design report. The final design report shall incorporate the comments from the 90 percent design review and include the following deliverables:

- 1. Final plans with Professional Engineer stamp and specifications
- 2. Final project construction schedule
- 3. A material distribution chart
- 4. Final Engineer's Opinion of Probable Construction Costs
- 5. Design Summary Report that includes the following items, at a minimum:
 - a. A narrative summary describing the background of the project, the design procedure followed and the design criteria used. The narrative summary should thoroughly explain all aspects and features of the design.
 - b. TMs documenting all of the various analyses performed during the course of the Contractor's design
- 6. Standard Operating Procedures

AWARD OF BID—REJECTION OF BID

The Navajo Nation Department of Water Resources reserves the right to accept bids all or in part. At the time of acceptance, the Navajo Nation Department of Water Resources also reserves the right to increase or decrease quantities of any item at the same price bid.

The Navajo Nation Department of Water Resources reserves the right to reject any or all bids or to accept any bid that in its judgment will be in the best interest of the general public. It is the intention to award contract to the lowest responsible bidder best meeting the requirements of the Navajo Nation Department of Water Resources.

PREFERENCE OF NAVAJO AND INDIAN-OWNED BUSINESSES

Preference of Navajo and Indian-owned businesses will be given under the Navajo Nation Business Opportunity Act, 5 NNC §201 et. seq., and the Navajo Nation Procurement Act, 12 NNC §303. Evaluation points will be awarded to Navajo and minority respondents. Certification of Navajo Owned Business will be assured by certificate held by the Navajo Nation Business Regulatory Department.

NAVAJO NATION SALES TAXES

All work performed within the territorial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation is subject to the six percent (6%) Navajo Sales TAX. 24 N.N.C. § 601 et. seq. The Navajo Nation shall withhold from each payment to the "CONTRACTOR" 6% of the total invoice amount associated with work performed within the Navajo Nation. This amount reflects the Navajo Sales Tax due on such invoice amount. This 6% shall be transferred to the Office of the Navajo Tax Commission as a payment of the tax on behalf of the "CONTRACTOR".

BID INSTRUCTIONS

Submit one (1) original Bid Proposal and **three** (3) **duplicate copies**. Mark original as "ORIGINAL". Original should contain signatures on any pages where a signature is required. This should be repeated for sealed bids, one (1) original "fee schedule" and three (3) duplicate copies with original marked as "ORIGINAL".

Bid proposals shall be submitted in a sealed envelope, marked "HELIUM LATERAL SIPHON DESIGN-BUILD, RE-BID #: 18-04-1825VJ – DO NOT OPEN" in the format shown in this bid packet.

The name and address of the bidding firm should be shown in the upper left hand corner of the envelope. Each submittal must be signed in the firm or corporate name and must bear the longhand signature of a principal duly authorized to make contracts for the bidding party. The bidder's name must be fully stated. Where submittals are signed by an agent of the bidder, evidence of his/her authority to act as the bidder's agent shall accompany the proposal.

TIME AND PLACE FOR RECEIPT OF BIDS

WITHDRAWAL OF BID

No bid proposal shall be withdrawn for a period of 60 calendar days after the opening of bids without the consent of the owner.

DEVIATIONS

All specifications listed are intended to be preferred design and performance. Where deviations from the specification are necessary, bidder will render equivalent reliability or performance. If there is insufficient room for detailing deviation, please indicate "see deviation" and attach, clearly indicating the bullet number on any such attachments. Failure to detail all such deviations will provide a basis for rejections of the entire proposal. Substantial deviations will not be considered.
